Over 25 years, the Pizzutti Open has raised more than \$142,000 for ACS, and over the past 5 years, has donated about \$45,000 to the JLRI.

Thanks to Greg & Grace for their friendship and partnership with the JLRI

This year, an Honorary Committee took the reins of this event, 6 JLRI members plus Grace working on the committee for the event, and had an additional 18 members of the JLRI support the event through either volunteering, donating or playing. This has always been a great event that is not primarily a self-funded event, i.e., the majority of the players and donors are not JLRI members.

In addition, we also had a fabulous donation of 150 back packs by Squad Locker that Carolyn Killian was able to get donated at a value of \$1500 for our "swag bags".

The open made a net income of \$7,156, after our \$5,000 donation to ACS and an additional donation to ACS of \$555 for donations made in honor of Greg and a partial donation of Kim Bigonette after donating

back the 50/50 raffle. In addition, we have a \$1500 matching gift pending from Bank of America thanks for Paul & MC Miller which is not included in the net income.
